## Monitoring your student's development at school

This monitoring booklet can help your student's progress. Their doctor needs to know what effect the medication is having on your student's development and whether there are any side effects.

Please monitor your student's progress once a week over the next few weeks, preferably on the same day every week. This booklet will play an important role in informing their doctor about their wellbeing at their next check up.

Each monitoring chart covers a week and different aspects of your student's behaviour. It also includes possible side effects. If you have any concerns, please let their parents know as soon as possible. Looking at your student over the week, please assess each statement on the chart and how well it relates to them during the last week. Then score the statements from 0 (Never/seldom) to 3 (Very often/frequent) by ticking the appropriate box for that statement. If you notice anything else, please write it down in the box at the bottom of the chart.

If your student experiences any problems with their medicine, these should be reported as soon as possible to their parent(s)/carer(s).
